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Jeffco Has Programs to Rehab Homes of Low & Moderate Income Families

When you hear the name Jefferson County Housing Authority, you probably, like me, think of subsidized housing.

Think again. One of the agency's most valuable programs is designed to help homeowners keep their homes in good repair.

The program is available to residents of unincorporated areas of Jefferson County, plus the cities of Golden, Lakewood, Wheat Ridge, and

other participating municipalities. Arvada has a similar program of its own - from what I've been told, it is identical.

Basically, the program provides 3 to 5% loans up to \$25,000 for making essential repairs to your home — things like roof repair, structural issues, electrical, plumbing and heating improvements, energy efficiency, and retrofitting

for handicapped accessibility. There are income requirements. Your total household income must

not exceed limits **REAL ESTATE** based on HUD guide-TODAY lines. For a family of one, the limit is \$40,200. For a family of four, it is \$57,450.
